Who says florals have to be feminine? A new generation of English and Irish artisans are bringing a tough edge and an urban aesthetic to flowers. Descended from Polish flower cultivators, Marcin Rusak casts blossoms in black resin, slices the material to reveal cross-sections of flower heads and stems, then shapes it into lamps, tables, and screens ([marcinrusak.com](http://marcinrusak.com)). Fellow Londoner Rachel Dein makes plaster and concrete casts of plants, herbs, and vegetables, from small tiles of a single specimen to larger panels that conjure ghostly gardens ([racheldein.com](http://racheldein.com)). And Sasha Sykes creates clear resin furniture encased with nests, ferns, and blossoms she finds near her home in rural Ireland ([farm21.co.uk](http://farm21.co.uk)). ## HOLLYWOOD MOMENT

She's descended from Hollywood royalty, she designs ultrachic handbags, and her jewel-box boutique on Manhattan's Upper East Side, Hayward House, has been a shopping mecca since it opened its doors last year. Now Marin Hopper's shop is branching out, becoming a go-to source for midcentury furniture. Thanks to a partnership with legendary Los Angeles antiques emporium JF Chen, Hayward House will offer such pieces as brass-and-leather klismos chairs and a Milo Baughman pony-skin sofa, all in perfect condition, each hand-picked by owner Joel Chen and shipped cross-country. "We're so lucky to partner with Joel," Hopper says. "His taste is brilliant. Just look at his Instagram, and you're drooling." The current selection of pieces is rooted in old Hollywood glamour—"the stuff I had in my living room growing up," says Hopper, the daughter of Dennis Hopper and Brooke Hayward and goddaughter of Jane Fonda.
